



Feline Wellness – The First Year

The following timeline represents an ideal protocol for your kitten. Times and items may be adjusted based on the age of the kitten at the first visit. Additional procedures may be added depending on the assessments made by the Doctor.

16 Weeks and beyond...

- Between 18 – 20 weeks of age the Rabies vaccination is given. One year later FVRCP, Leukemia and Rabies are boosted.
- Revolution should be applied monthly.
- Deworming medication should be given once a month until 6 months of age.
- Around 6 months of age your cat should be spayed or neutered.





Feline Wellness – Beyond the First Year

Physical Examinations

- Should be done annually and twice a year for cats over 7 years of age.
- Annual exams are also a good time to check fecal samples for parasites, and check blood and urine to ensure your cat is maintaining their optimal health, inside and outside.

Vaccinations

- The FVRCP and Rabies vaccinations are administered every 3 years, whereas the Feline Leukemia vaccination is administered annually.

Dental Cleanings

- Over 70% of cats over 5 years of age develop dental disease, which requires a full cleaning under anesthetic. Your doctor will examine your cat's teeth and mouth during physical examinations and decide if a dental cleaning is required. Brushing your cat's teeth regularly can help prevent tartar build up.

Flea & Parasite Control

- Revolution (a flea and parasite preventative) should be applied monthly. Even if your cat does not go outside you can bring fleas or parasites indoors on your clothes or shoes that can then transfer to your cat.
- After 6 months of age, deworming medication should be administered every 3 months.

Senior Wellness

- Cats are considered to be seniors when they are seven years old. Since our pets age much faster than we do, it is ideal to schedule two wellness check-ups each year for senior cats.
